"Students who receive a C-or below in English 4 or English 5 cannot repeat the course through regular UCR enrollment. To complete the Entry Level Writing requirement, those students must take an approved course at another institution (such as UCR Extension), where they will be charged a fee. The same policy applies to BW3 students who receive a grade of NC (See the UCR Entry Level Writing requirements website (<http://english.ucr.edu/elwr/index.html>) for further information. According to systemwide regulations, any student who has not satisfied the Entry Level Writing requirement after three quarters of university residence (three quarters of enrollment during the regular academic year) is not normally eligible to enroll for a fourth quarter at the University of California. (This three-quarter rule does not apply to students placed in BW3 until they begin English 4.) Students are encouraged to complete the requirement as soon as possible in their freshman year."
